







#### Who is Unipol?

- Administers the Leeds Rental Standard






A Code Property

#### Managing Agents – Some Tips

- Check who the owner is as the agent may be offering a 'let only'
- Try and talk to the current occupiers about their experiences with the agent/ owner (preferably without the agent's rep present)

 Check carefully about charges and sign-up fees

 Read the contract carefully and make sure you understand what you are agreeing to

#### Who is a Member?

Find out who is a full member of the Unipol Code or on their way towards full accreditation.

Students should be advised to visit the Unipol website to check an agent is listed before undertaking viewings and signings.


#### Which area to choose?

- Most students live in certain areas of Chapletown, Harehills, Woodhouse, or the City Centre within 5-15 minutes walk of good transport routes
- Many of these areas are classed as inner city areas so properties tend to be close together
- Crime is often higher in student areas not just in Leeds so just be aware






## House Hunting - Money


- Administration charges The NEW Tenant Fees Act comes in to operation today!
- Deposits. Most landlords will collect a deposit at the time you sign your contract. The average deposit across all landlords is £280 per person
- TV Licence. In most cases a TV licence is required.
   All BBC content whether watched live, by catch up or on demand will require a TV licence.

Guarantors. The website will display details if these are required.



## **House Hunting - Money**

- The rent sometimes includes items such as water charges, Wi-Fi etc.
- Increasingly all-inclusive rents are available so ask
- "All inclusive" rent is convenient, but can cost more than setting up the bills yourself
- Make sure it is outlined in your contract what bills you are responsible for




## **House Hunting - Money**

- The average rent on the website for a Unipol Code property is £86pppw, although areas such as Chapeltown and Harehills tend to be cheaper.
  - Bills are usually around £15pppw on the top of your rent
- Adverts on the website will state if bills are included




#### **Tenancy Deposit Scheme**

- Landlords are legally required to protect deposits.
- Students on giving a deposit should ask their landlord which scheme he/she will be using and expect their certificate of deposit protection within 30 days.

# House Hunting - Contracts and Tenancies

#### If Renting a whole house jointly:

- Then tenancy is likely to be a joint one signed by all the occupants and the owner
- This means that all the occupants are jointly and severally liable for each other's rent and conduct

#### If Renting as an individual:

- Then the tenancy will just be for you
- Make sure to check what your responsibility is for communal areas



## Right to Rent


All landlords apart from Universities and a few other exceptions must carry out a check on ALL students.

The landlord is required to make a copy and keep a record.




This guide is to help renters understand their rights and responsibilities. It provides a checklist on each stage of the house hunting process, including:

- what to do if things go wrong





# House Hunting - Contracts and Tenancies

#### **Rent Guarantee**

- As part of the agreement some owners may ask for your parents to guarantee your rent
- Parents or guardians should never sign an open ended guarantee – limit the liability to the level of your student's annual rent
- Most landlords who ask for a guarantee ask for individual ones but please clarify before signing anything.
